IBM:

Considering the continued Covid concerns the decision was made to hold our Interim Board Meeting (IBM) virtually instead of meeting face to face. The IBM was held via a Zoom conference call over a two day period on the 10th and 11th of September. Minutes of the meeting will be published with more details soon, however in summary:

- 1. The first day, Virtual Inc. our Management Partner briefed the Board regarding ongoing projects to include our new Member Experience effort, a report on membership, as well as a look at convention fundraising and the use of a new convention registration program, Cvent. More details coming soon!
- On the second day the Board met to conduct the ongoing business of WMA. Topics of discussion included:
 - o **Convention Planning Update**: We will use an online event registration program called Cvent. This will provide a "one-stop shopping" for getting us all prepared for the 2022 Convention. We will be able to register for Convention, make Hotel Room Reservations as well as sign up for tours, arrange for a roommate etc. All of these capabilities will be available via Cvent after the first of the year (2022). More details will be posted on our 2022 Convention Facebook page and in upcoming issues of '*Nouncements*.
 - Nomination Process: Will open this Fall in preparation to elect our new Governing Board next spring. We will use a new electronic voting program to allow for online voting and will include the ability to cast a hard copy ballot as well.

Hispanic Heritage Month:

National Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated each year from September 15 through October 15. The 2021 observance theme is "Esperanza: A Celebration of Hispanic Heritage and Hope."

- In 2004 Abigail D. Olmos became the first Hispanic female Master Gunnery Sergeant in the history of the Marine Corps.
- Two years later, in 2006, **Angela Salinas**, MajGen Ret, made history when she became the first Hispanic female to obtain the rank of "General" in the Marine Corps.
- Corporal Ramona M. Valdez (1984-2005) deployed with her unit to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi
 Freedom serving with the Female Search Force when she was killed when her convoy was attacked by a
 suicide bomber. The Marine Corps honored her memory by dedicating the II MEF Communications
 Training Center in Camp Lejeune, N.C. as the "Valdez Training Facility."
