### Helen E. Moore, 1920-2014, WMA Past National President

Helen Johnson Moore, WMA Past National President, passed away January 4 at her home in Indiana.

Helen, who was a founding member of WMA, served as president from 1966-1968.

Born December 10, 1920, Helen was the second of eleven children born to John Brackenridge Johnson, Jr. and Mary Amelia Custer.

Seven of those siblings served in the military. All five of her brothers, Helen and a sister served.

Helen enlisted February 19, 1943-six days after the Marine Corps opened its ranks to women.

She attended boot camp at Hunter College in New York City, and was assigned to the Pentagon.

She married Marine Harry Moore in 1954, and their union was blessed with a son, William.

Although she had a short Marine Corps career, Helen spent most of her life working for veterans. This includes her work with WMA, the American Legion and American Le-

gion Auxiliary, and the Women's Forum on National Security.

She was invited to the White House in 1967 when President Lyndon B. Johnson signed Public Law 90-130, removing legal restrictions on women's promotions that had kept them out of the general and flag ranks. The bill made it possible for women to become general officers.

In 1968, the *Indianapolis Star* named Helen one of the ten most outstanding women in Indiana.

In 1984 and 1999, she was awarded the Sagamore of the Wabash, which at the time, was the highest honor bestowed by the Governor of Indiana. Last year, she was recognized by the American Legion Auxiliary for 63 years of service.

She is survived by three sisters and two brothers.



# National Service Award (NSA) Nominations Due

As we approach our Biennial Convention and Professional Development Conference, it is time to consider nominations for the National Service Award (NSA). Authorization of this award was granted to procure appropriate recognition for individuals making significant contributions to the National Association by implementing the objectives of WMA.

Any WMA member can nominate an individual for the award but it must be submitted for consideration and approval by the National Board of Directors through a member of the National Board. (National Board members include; President, Immediate Past President, 1st/2nd/3rd/ Vice President's, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Secretary and all 10 Area Directors. The proposal must be in writing and must contain the rationale and justification for the pro-

posal. It is important to remember that if you propose a nominee for this award, you need to make strong, clear reasoning and justification since this proposal will be what the Board of Directors will base their voting upon. The proposal must also contain the wording that will be read to the convention delegates and guests at the time of the presentation.

Criteria for the award include:

• Nominees should have contributed significantly to the achievement of the WMA national purposes. Awards should not be authorized simply for performance of duties expected. This would apply to elected or appointed officers. An exception might be made for dedication above and beyond the call of duty. It is important to remember that this is the highest award that is given by our association and it should be preserved and not diluted in any way.

- An individual cannot receive more than one National Service Award for the same service. They may be nominated again for different reasons.
- No more than three (3) National Service Awards are to be awarded at a convention. If the board decides that NO applicant fulfills the high standards of this award, then no award need be given.
- A non-member may be nominated for this award if their service is recognized as meeting the criteria for the National Service Award.

Please submit your nominations for consideration to any member of the National Board of Directors **no later than April 15**. Let's all help to recognize those WMA members who have made a difference is supporting our National Purposes.

# **Bring On Our History: Some Noteworthy Marines**

The **Did You Know** items have been very popular in the last two issues and I thought that you might enjoy more on unique women who have earned the title Marine.

**Did you know** that two women Marines had been held as prisoners of the Japanese prior to United States declaring war on Japan?

Charlotte Day Gower was the Dean of Women at Lingnan University in Hong Kong, China during the initial Japanese attack on the city. Charlotte has been credited with setting up first aid stations and leading rescue operations in the city before being captured. Interned in a Japanese prison camp, she taught Chinese to her fellow prisoners. After five months as a prisoner, she was repatriated in a prisoner exchange. Captain Charlotte Day Gower became one of the first eight women sworn into the Marine Corps in January 1943 to serve as Director of Training for the Women's Reserve.

Marine Staff Sergeant Mary Virginia Herst of Kansas was teaching in Bangkok, Thailand, when the Japanese attacked. She spent nine months in a prisoner of war camp before being repatriated in a prisoner of war exchange. After training in multiple aviation MOS's, Mary was assigned to MCAS El Toro, CA.

Did you know that PFC Peggy Urzendowski while never a prisoner of the Japanese, had spent most of her life growing up in Singapore, Hong Kong and the Philippines? While fleeing the Japanese, she found herself on the island of Corregidor during two horrific Japanese bombing attacks. She was picked up by a troop transport headed for New Zealand where she managed transport to Australia and then on to Hawaii and eventually back to the States. Once home, Peggy quickly enlisted in the USMCWR and was stationed at Marine Corps Base, San Diego.

**Did you know** that two women served as Marines in WWI and WWII?

Martrese Thek Ferguson served as a Marine in WWI and was admitted to the first OCS class at Mount Holyoke in 1943, graduating first in her class. Commissioned a first lieutenant at graduation, she rose to the rank of lieutenant

colonel commanding the 2,000 Women Marines assigned to Henderson Hall, HQMC. LtCol Ferguson proudly wore her WWI Victory Medal and the Good Conduct Medal.

Lillian O'Malley Daly proudly wore the Marine green during both WWI and WWII and proudly wore her WWI medals. Captain Daly was a direct commission in January 1943 immediately transferred to Camp Pendleton to fill the position of West Coast Liaison for the Women's Reserve.

Both of these proud Marines served in WWI in the Office of the Inspector Adjutant.

**Did you know** that three other women with unique World War I records served as Marines in World War Two?

Helen O'Neill proudly wore Navy blue as a WWI Yeoman (F) and had 25 years of naval civil service before she received a direct commission into the Marines in January 1943. Having worked for numerous Assistant Chiefs of Naval Operations, she was well known by senior Marine Corps leadership. Major O'Neill was also a linguist in Latin, French, Spanish and Russian. She also formed the National Yeoman (F) organization. the first former service organization of the US Naval Reserve and had held a senior position in the organization. She served as Deputy of the Director of Women Marines during WWII.

Frances W. Pepper joined the staff of the Marine Corps in 1923 as a civilian employee working in the Office of the Adjutant and Inspectors Department. Frances also held a Bachelor of Law Degree and was made admitted to the District of Columbia Bar 1931. She later did post-graduate work in international law. She attended the third Women's Officer Class at Mount Holyoke and was commissioned a captain at the completion of the course. In WWI, she worked for the Young Women's Christian Organization(YWCA) and was assigned to General Pershing's headquarters in France. She was recognized by General Pershing for her work on ,numerous programs assisting Soldiers and Marines.

Helen Crean while assigned to the American Red Cross in France was awarded the French Croix de Guerre

for heroism under fire while working at the dressing station for wounded in Glorieux, France. When the station came under heavy bombing and machine gun fire, her gallant actions in protecting the wounded during the attack resulted in her being awarded her medal. Also while in France she gathered information and needs of the wounded in numerous field hospitals and dressing stations in the area of Verdun and opened a canteen for the 5th Marine Regiment at Naix- au-Forge. In WWII, Major Helen Crean served as the Commanding Officer of women units at MCAS Santa Barbara, CA, and at MCAS Ewa, Territory of Hawaii.

Did you know you could hop a freighter to be a Marine, and that's exactly what happened to *Natica R. Macy*. Natica was living in Bermuda when the public announcement was made that the United States Marine Corps Women's Reserve was recruiting members. She literally jumped an old Greek freighter bound for the States and worked her way by painting decks, caulking wood and standing watch as the only woman member of the crew. It was literally the first ship out to the US.

#### **Known by Generations**

Recently, WMA lost a very special Marine, a WWII Marine; Emma Holmes joined our Corps with the same desire as her sister Marines in WWII to "Free a Marine to Fight", but that was not to be. Emma sustained a paralyzing spinal injury during boot camp that changed her life, forever. Emma Holmes, while a patient at a VA hospital in Florida met two WW I women Marines veterans who were Gray Lady volunteers.)

Emma kept in contact with these women and volunteered to take on the project of trying to contact as many of their sister Marines that she could.

She would write to them and started exchanging letters with them and gradually en massed a listing of 130 "WW One derfuls", as she named them. She also learned that these women wanted to reach out to their former buddies.



To fulfill their wishes, Emma sent another letter asking each to tell of her time in the Corps, single name, place of birth, her friends in the Corps, duty station, and any other info she wanted passed on to the other WWI women. Emma then gathered all the letters and created a newsletter, retyping each letter received (on a manual typewriter) and then printing the newsletter on a hand operated mimeograph machine, sending the final newsletter to the women and WMA who then let chapters know about these women. In 1976, Emma received WMA's National Service Award for "her untiring and devoted dedication to our World War I Women Marines ....".

In 2013, at the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation Awards dinner she was one of the recipients of the WMA Colonel Julia Hamblet Award for her momentous efforts and inspiration to complete the first known complete listing of the Women Marines who served in World War I. The Emma Holmes Collection is a treasured part of the Women of the Corp Collection.

Emma passed away in early December 2013 at the age of 93. Now Emma is home with her "WW One derfuls!"

# News from the Women of the Corps Collection

Thanksgiving week allowed us to host a working party at the Collection. WMA member and WOCC Foundation President Sara Phoenix, her sister Deb, and new step-daughter Patty came for the week. Patty is hoping for entry in the 2014 Class at the United States Air Force Academy and spent time touring with a

USAFA sponsor while yours truly, Sara and Deb worked at the Collection. Lots of work and some fun topped off with 20 for Thanksgiving Dinner!

The family of WMA member Annette Howard has graciously put together a collection in her honor. The majority of this family has served in our armed forces, not all have been Marines, but they all understand preserving the history of our service members. It has been my pleasure to interact with a number of them. The family's effort has been fantastic, resultting in a great addition to the WOCC.

The WOCC has gratefully accepted items belonging to one of our past Sergeants Major of Women Marines from the NMMC as well as excess Woman Marine items from another Marine Corps Museum. We are grateful for them thinking of the WOCC. The cost of maintaining items has risen in the last few years and museums and collections have to make tough choices concerning what to keep. We have received items from numerous collections that cannot afford or lack space to maintain what comes to them.

The WOCC has accepted all that these organizations have offered. These wonderful and often unique items have found a new home in the WOCC. Three years ago, evidence in a trial of a veterans scam in Las Vegas was gathered by WMA members. It contained items from at least 7 WWII women Marines and the covers of a few more.

If not for the WOCC these Marines and their treasures of service would have be-

come trash. The WOCC focus is to maintain not only Women Marine history but the history of individual Marines.

The Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast, Department of the Navy formally, requested the WOCC curator and historian to assist with an environmental assessment that will impact the disposition of four historical buildings at MCRD Parris Island.

Two of the buildings had been heavily related to women Marines and two are unique buildings that should not be lost. The curator/historian submitted a package of comments and suggestions of use based on the historical aspects of the buildings and offered suggestions on historical preservation.

The Women of the Corps Foundation (WCF) is doing a great job financially by providing 100 percent of our funding to date of WMA's Women of the Corps Collection. Any financial contribution you can make to support their efforts will be greatly appreciated.



### Claudine Harris Barnett, 1913-2013: "A Marine at Heart"

Claudine Harris Barnett, 100, a 12 year resident of Severna Park, MD, died of natural causes on December 30, 2013 at Baltimore Washington Medical Center in Glen Burnie.

Born Mary Claudine Harris on November 22, 1913 to Evan Lilburn Harris and Annie Isaacs Harris of Charleston, WV, she was raised in Charleston, cherishing her time canoeing and swimming on the Elk River where her father had purchased a fishing camp that is still in the family. Claudine received her undergraduate degree from Marshall College in 1936 and later, her Master's degree in Physical Education from West Virginia University. For several years she taught school in a coal mining camp in the Cabin Creek area of West Virginia.

Claudine enlisted in the Marine Corps during WWII and was one of the earliest women admitted to Marine Officer Candidate School, earning her commission as a Second Lieutenant in August 1944. While her active service concluded with the ending of WWII, she remained a Marine at heart. In November 2013, she proudly attended the Marine Corps Commandant's Ball commemorating the 238th anniversary of the founding of the Corps. As the oldest Marine in attendance, she participated with the Commandant, in the ritual cutting of

the ceremonial cake.

# **Chapter Tool Kit: Federal Tax Information**

It is nearly that time of year...tax time...so I take this "tool kit" opportunity to remind chapters about the necessity of filing with the IRS. The Women Marines Association is exempt under the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3), and may receive tax deductible donations in accordance with this Code. The activities that qualify WMA National for exemption include the extensive scholarship program, the educational and historical programs sponsored, the grant program, and other donations made in support of veterans and veteran programs. Most...but not all...WMA chapters are exempt as 501(c)(19), the designation authorized for organizations falling under an established 501 © (3) and whose members are predominantly past or present members of the United States Armed Forces. Donations to a 501(c)(19) organization normally are not deductible as a charitable contribution.

Small tax-exempt organizations, like most of our chapters, whose annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000\* or less are required to electronically submit Form 990-N, also known as the e-Postcard, unless they choose to file a complete Form 990 or Form 990-EZ.

(\*Note: The gross receipts was raised from \$25.000 after the last full revision of the "How To..")

Information you will need to file the e-Postcard:

- Employer Identification Number (EIN), which the chapter requested from IRS when established
- Tax year.
- Legal name and mailing address.
- The URL of the Chapter's website (if there is one).
- A statement indicating whether the Chapter intends to continue in existence for the next year,
- Any other names the organization uses.
- Name and address of a principal officer.






