The 2014 convention is over; everyone had a great time; and we are now off and running with great enthusiasm and a new slate of officers. If you don't



know me, I served for 12 years during the Vietnam Era (1965-77). I then went into the Aerospace Industry and retired from Lockheed Martin 13 years ago. It is an honor and a privilege to be serving as your new 1st Vice President because WMA has become a very important part of my life and I really enjoy working with the amazing women who belong to WMA and who served in our Corps. 



Note to Chapters: The I.R.S. Problem Has Been Resolved

Many of our chapters received letters from the IRS stating that they did not file their 990N for 2012. These letters were written in error because all of the chapters who notified National about receiving such a letter are actually current with their 990N reporting. In order to "fix" this problem, our National Treasurer filed a 990N for all the chapters that received such letters. These filings were submitted on 16/17 August. This satisfies the IRS requirement to respond by Aug 27. Chapters don't need to send anything to the IRS. Chapters for whom a 990N was submitted include: 2014 Convention, AL-1, CA-1, CA-10, CA-11, CA-15, CA-2, CA-29, CA-5, CA-7, FL-11, FL-4, INT-1, NAT-1, NC-1, NC-2, NM-1,

NY-5, OH-2, OR-3, SC-2, TX-1, WA-3, and WV-1.

If your chapter is not listed above and you did receive such a letter, please send a brief message to your area director and to the National Treasurer at Treasurer@womenmarines.org stating that you are in receipt of such a letter. Be sure to give the treasurer your chapter number (i.e., TX-1).

It is our understanding that some of the chapters tried to get information about this problem prior to the convention and were less than successful in getting a response from National.

For this communication breakdown, we sincerely apologize. Please know that we have a new board in place and we have actively worked this problem as our highest priority. For information only, we have identified a fix to the problem that causes generation of such letters and the National Treasurer will be working with the IRS to address and correct this problem. Any chapters who receive such letters in the future should notify the National Treasurer via their Area Director.

tary of the Colorado Freedom Memorial, Chaplain for the Marine Corps League, past Secretary and current cochair of the Membership Committee for United Veterans Committee of Colorado, past chair of the Aurora Veteran Affairs Commission, and much more. She works tirelessly to help veterans and their families in Colorado.

She will be planning the Memorial Day and Veterans Day events at the Marine

Memorial this year, the Marine Memorial 5K at Aurora Reservoir is September, and she is the originator of the Aurora Memorial Day Ceremony at the Aurora Municipal Center. Her service didn't end when her tour of duty in the Marine Corps ended (1967-71). She is a Southwest Denver native and a proud Coloradoan! As one of 6 children (4 boys-2girls) she is the only one with military service and she served as an Air Controller at

Quantico, VA. She also had a distinguished career with the VA, IRS, and 21 years with the US Customs Service.

She was widowed in 2009 when her husband of nearly 40 years died from Agent Orange cancer as a 100% disabled veteran. Her unending devotion to veterans isn't done for recognition, nonetheless we thank her for all she does.

Remembering Our History

The OSS and Captain Charlotte Day Gower, USMCWR

Back in 1974, a blockbuster book was written called Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy, by John Le Carré. In recent months, I was contacted by a graduate student working on her thesis requesting to know, what I knew, about WWII Marine Charlotte Day Gower. While I only knew what I thought was a small amount of this Marine's history, I knew enough to be of help to the grad student. While providing the information I knew, the Le Carre' book popped back into my mind and I thought a title for a Charlotte Day Gower book could be Anthropologist, University Dean, US Marine, Spy. Giving this

unique WWII Marine such a title, however, would, even today, only tell us a little of her life. So let me fill you in on what is known about this "Mystery Marine."

Charlotte Day Gower was born in 1902 in Kankakee, Illinois and led an ordinary American life until she started her college education. A good student, Charlotte attended Smith College and received her bachelor's degree in 1922 at age 20. She changed her direction from seeking a medical degree to anthropology and chose to study at the University of Chicago where she received her master's degree in 1926 followed in 1928 by her Ph.D., a rare accomplishment for a woman of that time, ethnologist and the author of Milocca, A Sicilian Village as part of her thesis work for her Ph.D.

In the 1930's, Dr. Charlotte Gower accepted dual positions as Dean of Students and teacher at Lingnan University, Hong Kong. Life in Hong Kong was exciting until the Japanese started their conquests through the Pacific. Hong Kong, considered the "Gem of the Pacific" in that era, started preparing for war in the late 1930's. By 1941, fortifications and troops were protecting Hong Kong. The British could not hope to defeat the Japanese, but they did hope for a delaying period so that other islands and countries in the Pacific could increase their defenses. At 8:00 am on December 8, 1941 the Japanese attacked. Charlotte not satisfied to stand by, organized and set-up first aid stations throughout the city of Hong Kong. On December 25, Great Britain surrendered Hong Kong to the Japanese, and Charlotte, as well as others found assisting the British and Chinese, were interned as prisoners of war. This included civilians, foreign workers, diplomats, the international community and military. Charlotte, understanding that the military would return to fight the Japanese, taught both Japanese and Chinese, to the military and diplomatic personnel. Charlotte was repatriated after several months as a POW. After arriving home in the United States in mid to late fall of 1942, Charlotte was briefed on the future USMCWR and asked if she was interested.

From our Marine perspective, Charlotte served as a WWII Marine who was unique in the fact that she was one of the small handful of women, sworn in before the nationwide public announcement (Feb 13, 1943) that women would

> be recruited into the Corps. Sworn in as a captain, who would, supposedly, be the USMCWR Representative for Training, at the time of commissioning, Charlotte would have been forty-one years old by 1943.

Little else was known about Charlotte Gower until Lieutenant Colonel Patricia Mead, USMC, wrote about her in The Marine Corps Women's Reserve in WWII. This book was the first official Marine Corps history published on the women who served in WWII.

Little has ever been known of her military service, and later, as you read, you will discover the reason. I spoke with WMA memadding to this fete she was also a trained 1902-1982. (This photo is believed ber June Whitehurst, who served in the early days of 1943 in Colonel Streeter's office, if she knew Captain Gower. The response was

> that there was a captain who would drop by their area and then leave after checking in with Colonel Streeter. The captain always left Colonel Streeter's office as a bit of a mystery to her staff. I had reached that same conclusion while researching the original handful of WWII women officers, sworn in January and February 1943 before the public announcement of the USMCWR, a number of years ago.

> Research back then and now has provided has provided the following on Captain Gower.

> She served from January 1943 until late 1947 when she was discharged. Throughout that entire time, her actual job remained a bit of a mystery. Apparently, while serving our Corps, Captain Gower was actually working for the OSS (Office of Strategic Services), the forerunner of the CIA. Once discharged, Charlotte Day Gower was the first or second woman recruited by the CIA (Central Intelligence Agency). She retired from the CIA in 1964 after spending her military (Continued)

and civilian life as an Intelligence Officer for the CIA. At some point Charlotte married, but nothing is known (as yet) on her husband. After retirement she resided in Washington DC and died in 1982 of at the age of 80.

Ms. Todd, the graduate student that contacted me, has requested the files of Charlotte Day Gower Chapman from the CIA for review. She has not been granted permission or the files, as yet.

HQMC has also been queried and it appears that their files on Captain Gower may also reside with the CIA at this time. Ms. Todd has agreed to share whatever information she may receive. I have written various British Military Archives for information on Charlotte as a POW as well as a Colonial History of Hong Kong organization for information they may have on Charlotte's civilian career in Hong Kong and information on her rescue work during the Japanese attack.

Months of locating documented research from numerous sources has provided us with this beginning story of Charlotte Day Gower Chapman. Stay tuned for more on this unique story as more research comes in to us.

World War Two Personal Stamps

America was coming out of the Depression, and money was still in short supply when America started the buildup for WWII. Americans volunteered by the hundreds of thousands, many arrived with no shoes, or holes in the ones they had on, clothes were few and personal items minimal, but they answered the call of their nation. Luxury items such as watches and cameras were near nonexistent among those that served in the early years of the war. Families did not attend boot camp graduation ceremonies. Time, restricted travel and cost did not allow military grad ceremonies similar to those of today. No money for travel and moving the military made civilian travel nearly impossible, yet the desire to see their loved ones in uniform and healthy was still in their hearts. The solution was a postage size stamp of the service man of woman in uniform, including their covers. The head and shoulders photos were sold in sheets of 100 stamps for \$1.00 with a pre-glued back. Towns, cities and larger military command post offices had the needed cameras, and the program was quickly in place. The stamps could not be used for postage fees on a letter or postcard and had no monetary value as did regular postage stamps of the day.

One of our earliest WOCC collections to arrive provided a huge treasure of military uniforms and memorabilia. This unique collection provided our first look at these unique stamps. Starting our research with the US Postal Service, we found out more on the stamp program but we also discovered the fact their files did not have much information on the stamps nor did they possess any of these unique stamps. Three individual loose photo stamps (in the donor's name) were shared with the Postal Service, from the multiple sheets

and loose stamps in the WOCC collection, saving more American history.

By late 1943 or early 1944 the US Postal service stopped the program due to war overload of the US Postal Service. Civilian professional photographers took over making the stamps. While increasing the cost of the stamps, some civilian photographers also changed the stamps in appearance as well. The majority of the professional stamp photos remained the military head shot; however, a percentage of the photos became somewhat risqué at times. Covers were removed, women opened their uniform collars, removed their uniform jackets and heads were often angled with "comehither" smiles. It was apparent that women of all the services were sending these photos to others than family and hometowns. The WOCC has received a few more examples over the years but the stamps are very rare and hard to find.

More Women Marine Stamps Recruiting Stamps

Stamps were constant reminders of the personnel needs of

the Armed Forces. They were added to the front of military and civilian mail and given out to servicemen and women for their personal mail. The women Marine stamps were issued from 1943 until late 1944 when Allied victory was more assured. These stamps like the personal stamps could not be used to cover mailing costs and had no monetary



value. Recruiting in the WOCC for a number of years and are often used in exhibits, lectures and student graduate studies. A total of four stamps were done highlighting the USMCWR.

Federal Postage Stamps

A Woman Marine Stamp was issued in 1968 to commemorate the 25th Anniversary of Women Marines as part of the **Year of the Woman Marine**. The first day of issue took place in San Francisco and was a major press event.

The Year of the Woman Marine 1968

The Commandant called Marine Reservist, Colonel Ruth Broe to active duty in 1966 to develop a program to irst honor women Marines and to turn that program into a major recruiting program that would have a huge effect on women's recruiting in the years to come. Colonel Broe was extremely talented and creative in the public relations field and devised a number of programs and events to recognize, and honor women Marines. The program kicked off in 1968 and honored the 25 years of continuous This was in the files of the Year of the Woman Marines service by Women Marines that started in 1943. and may have been a pro-*Note:* Every woman Marine unit celebrated the posed or used graphic. woman's anniversary started that started with

the 1st anniversary on February 13, 1944. Engraved invitations, and cake cutting ceremonies, lunches or formal dinners, were common place at all commands with women assigned. Invitations to events were sought after by senior staff (officer and enlisted and their ladies). niversary was never considered to be a birthday celebration, as all Marines celebrate only one birthday, that of November 10th.

Colonel Broe planned an exciting year long program of events. She started by making the first official attempt to locate the names and contact data from HQMC files on the women who served in WWI. Less than a third of the women were listed in HQMC files, but it was a start, and those found were invited to be part of the ceremonies.

The following is a partial listing of the numerous organized activities and events that took place in 1968.

- 1968 Woman Marine Postage Stamp, First Day of Issue, San Francisco, by the Postmaster General of the United States followed by a celebration luncheon, with the national press covering the event from Coast to Coast.
- Women Marine Color guards conducted morning and evening colors at all commands with women units on February 13, 1968.
- The first all-female shooting battery conducted morning colors to rave reviews.
- The "Woman Marine Waltz" was written and played at the Marine Corps Banquet and Ball held in Washington DC, and first danced by CMC and a woman Marine Corporal.
- The Governors Platoons consisting of two women from each state made up two boot camp platoons. Graduates were honored by meetings/luncheons with their home state governors, senators and congressman after graduations.
- Women Marine recruiting jumped significantly in the Year of the Woman Marine, far exceeding Marine Corps goals for the year of 1968 and into 1969.
- Governor Proclamations from all 50 states were issued



- honoring women Marines on their February 13, 1968 anniversary.
- Women Officers sent group photos from each command as did our enlisted women. These were presented to the Commandant and Director of Women Marines in anniversary books.
- Molly Marine Ceremony, Molly underwent a major preservation followed by a huge ceremony honoring Molly Marine, with all past WM Directors present as well as General Hurst who as a Major set-up the first classes at Mt Holyoke and Hunter College. National news coverage, formal luncheon, Molly celebration including the sculptor of Molly, Enrique Alferez, was part of the public events.
- Women Commands sent unit gift/ photo memories to HQMC, representing continental and overseas women Marine units or teams. They included Hawaii, Okinawa, Iwakuni, embassies, and NATO Headquarters Europe.
- An Evening Parade at Marine Barracks 8th and I was dedicated to the women Marines and attended by WM's past and present from numerous commands as well as all Directors of the Woman Marines and Sergeant Majors of the Women Marines. This parade was attended by CMC, General Officers from major commands, Congressman and Senators and other noteworthy politicians, residents of DC and newsmen.
- Women Marine Units across the US lead Veteran Day Parades in major cities across the US.

The "Year of the Woman Marine" was such a huge success that the Marine Corps received the 1969 "Silver Anvil **Award**", the most prestigious Public Relations Award given for outstanding performance in the world. This was the first Marine Corps win of this renowned award, and has only received a couple awards over the last 40+ years. Colonel Ruth Broe received the award at the Public Relations Society Ceremony to a standing ovation. The "Year of the Woman Marine" set a much higher bar for future Marine Programs.

Colonel Broe went on to become the President of WMA and her husband, Retired Marine Richard Broe, founded the Loyal Escorts.


