

Marine Corps Women Reserves 74th Anniversary

This year marks the 74th anniversary of the Marine Corps Women Reserves and WMA chapters across the country have been or will be celebrating this early historic mileauto mechanics, drivers, aerial gunner instructors, cryptographers, stenographers, post exchange managers, control tower operators, cooks, quartermasters, and telegraph op-

Even though the first women Marines had enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1918 during World War I, the need for their support decreased at the end of the war and they were all transferred to inactive service by July of 1919.

When the United States en-

tered World War II in 1941, there was once again a need for women in the ranks. Initially though, the idea of women serving in the Marine Corps at the outbreak of the second World War did not have much support from congress or the branches of the military service. It was not until 30 July 1942 that President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed into law the establishment of a women's reserve for the Marine Corps. Then it took until 13 February 1943 before the Marine Corps Women Reserves was actually formed.

Thousands of women flocked to recruiting centers to join the Marine Corps - eager to serve their country and drawn by posters with the slogan, "Free a Man to Fight." The qualifications for these early women Marine recruits were rigid. They had to be at least 20 years old, could not be married to a Marine, and could not have minor children. In addition, they were required to have more education than a male recruit.

The first class of women recruits completed their recruit training at Hunter College in Bronx, New York. The first class of officer candidates trained at Mount Holyoke College in South Hadley, Massachusetts. By July of 1943 both enlisted and officer training for women Marine recruits were transferred to New River, North Carolina, where almost 19,000 women ended up completing their training.

Once in the fleet, women Marines served in over 200 assignments. Some of the many positions they filled included radio operators, photographers, parachute riggers,



At first, the Marine Corps didn't know what to call these women reserves, or WRs. A flurry of nicknames were tossed around, including names such as Femarines, Dainty Devil Dogs, Marinettes, and Glamarines. Finally, General Thomas Holcomb, the 17th Comman-

dant of the Marine Corps announced, "They are Marines. They don't have a nickname and they don't need one. They get their basic training in a Marine atmosphere at a Marine post. The inherit the traditions of Marines. They are Marines".

General Alexander A. Vandegrift, 18th Commandant of the Marine Corps, was quoted as saying that women Marines in WWII could "feel responsible for putting the 6th Marine Division in the field; for without the women filling jobs throughout the Marine Corps, there would not have been sufficient men available to form that division."

At the end of the war, demobilization of the Marine Corps Women's Reserve began. By July of 1946, of the approximately 20,000 women who served, only 1000 remained.

On 12 June 1948 women were made a permanent part of the regular Marine Corps when Congress passed the Wom-



en's Armed Services Integration Act.

Job well done, to these female heroines who laid the groundwork for all of us! One day, there will be no need to count our "firsts", because we will be a total integrated force. But, until then...Let us never forget their esprit de corps and forever remember the significance of their service! We are women by gender...Marines for Life!

Chapter Sets up Account for Marine Injured in Vehicle Accident

On Sunday, 5 December 2016, MN-1 Minnesota Leathernecks Chapter was notified of a motor vehicle accident involving Pvt. Olivia Nord, a recent boot camp graduate from Parris Island, SC, and her mother, Jenny.

The accident occurred after family friends had picked up Jenny and Olivia from the Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport and were traveling on Interstate 494 to meet other acquaintances. Their vehicle was struck by a driver traveling the wrong way on the Interstate. Both Jenny and Olivia were taken to the Hennepin County Medical Center for treatment of their extensive injuries. On or about 11 January 2017, Olivia was transferred to the Minneapolis VA Health Care System, where she will continue to receive medical care and treatment for her extensive injuries.

A Caring Bridge website (https://www.caringbridge.org/signin) was set up for the Nord family. Once a login has been created, you can search for Jenny & Olivia Nord to view past journal entries and be kept up to date on Olivia's progress. Under the "Ways to help Jenny & Olivia" you can donate by clicking on the "Support Links - Olivia Nord Fund". This will take to you a PayPal screen. This is where you can donate specifically to the fund that has been

set up by Chapter MN-1 at Wells Fargo for Olivia Nord. (Please note: it is NOT a GoFundMe page, which takes a portion of any donations, nor is it a donation to the Caring Bridge website. Some may have donated under the belief that they were donating to the Nord Family fund but may have accidently donated to the Caring Bridge website.)



The enthusiasm from this Area 1 luncheon has sparked a new interest to have other regional luncheons throughout the area. On



February 18th, we will be having a metro New York region lun-

cheon on Long Island to celebrate our 74th anniversary of United States Women Marines. And we are in the early stages of planning another luncheon in New Hampshire this summer. As women, we've come a long way. From World War I to current day, women have evolved into combat-ready machines with physical and emotional strength and skills that far outweigh that of other women. We are sisters, we are family. Nobody gets us, but us. We are United States Marines. We are veterans. We all volunteered and we all earned the title "Marine." Regardless of where or when we served, we all have walked our post in a military manner as we served our great country. It is good for us to take the time to remember our sacrifices we have made.

A new mission that Area 1 has focused on during the holiday season has been the homeless female veteran. So many of us get caught up in the traditional Toys-for-Tots programs and good will toward senior citizens (which is all very important); however, many forget about the homeless who enjoy simple things like a clean pair of socks or their own wash cloth and toiletry items. So, with the help of our own WMA Public Relations Officer (PRO), Mary Ann Merritt, we launched a successful campaign via Amazon to provide needed items to two separate shelters for homeless female veterans; one in Ballston Spa, NY and the other in Bridgeport, CT. The homeless female veteran population seems to be growing with the increase of military women, but there are fewer services to help them at this point. These sister veterans are slow to ask for help – because, like us, they have always had to do it on their own and learn to carry their own pack.

I have continued to seek more information on ways Area 1 can support the homeless shelters for female veterans in the New York and New England states. It's a bit overwhelming right now, but "we take care of our own" and we are committed to making a difference for our sister veterans going forward. I'm discovering that, although there are shelters for women, few are designated just for female veterans. The states are working hard at improving the options for our sisters. Each shelter has a limited number of beds (avg. 12-20) and there is a limited amount of time a veteran can stay at the shelter (usually 90 days).

In addition to collecting Toys-for-Tots at the holiday meeting, CT-1 also collected items for the shelter in Bridgeport, CT. Chapter President, Jennifer Jackson, personally delivered the items to the shelter. Everyone experienced great joy in the giving, as well as those in the receiving. Thank you to everyone in WMA for supporting this mission of helping our homeless sister veterans.

Lastly, the inaugural Connecticut Veterans Day Patriot Race, cofounded by my husband and I, was a huge success. After all the expenses, we donated \$1,000 each to the Area 1 WMA, the local American Legion, the local VFW and the DAV; members from each organization assisted in making the race day successful. It was decided at the luncheon to fund a \$500 WMA scholarship for a qualified Area 1 student for 2017.

The Marines from Area 1 are on the move, marching forward and in step, and full of esprit de corps!






