June is a month of new beginnings and celebrations. Graduations, completing another year of school and anniversaries. And, this month also brings a huge transition for our women Marines – the deactivation of the 4th Recruit Training Battalion. This is not new news as it has been broadcasted through our social media links for awhile now. It is a necessary transition and one that was to be expected eventually. Now that time is here. WMA was present at the deactivation ceremony on 15 June 2023. This battalion will always be part of our legacy and WMA will continue to preserve its rich history and legacy as long as we are around.

Welcome back to Adrienne Mclarahmore! Adrienne has been voted in to be our new Director of Membership. Adrienne is very familiar with service at the National level as she served successfully as the WMA National Treasurer from 2016 – 2018. She received WMA's National Service Award for confirming the public charity status of WMA and stopping WMA from becoming a private foundation during that tax period. Filing the 990 e-postcards for all chapters, with none losing their 501(c) 19, executed the budget, and seamlessly switched the publisher and mailing location of 'Nouncements.

The Collection was held under the Women of the Corps Foundation. A non-profit 501(c)(3) dedicated to the preservation and promotion of women's history within Marine Corps history and traditions. Unfortunately, WMA cannot either afford financially or from a volunteer manpower perspective to manage a collection of this size. WMA's Director of Programs, PK Horton, and our History Committee, headed by Jeannine Franz, will be headed to Kerrville, Texas in August 2023 to begin the inventory and distribution of the collection back to their donors (who have requested they be returned if the WOCC folded); to a variety of museums (such as Museum of the Carolinas in Camp Johnson) and the Parris Island collection. The National Museum of the Marine Corps will also take possession of some items, but not all. The intent is to maintain as many items as possible for use by WMA in the future for conventions and other special events. Photographs and other memorabilia will also be preserved and our Director of Marketing and "Nouncements Editor will ensure they are used appropriately.

It is unfortunate that this collection had to come to this, but if we look at it with a brighter look, it

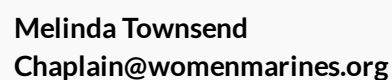
And lastly, the Women of the Corps Collection (WOCC) has been legally transitioned back to WMA.
